Tuition increases announced

Tuition increases announced

The Loyola University Chicago Board of Trustees evaluated and approved tuition increases for the fall semester of 1997. University administrators are making a concerted effort to get this information to all Loyola students in a timely and consistent manner this week:

CrossCampus, the Web newsletter for undergraduates, will be on-line with information early Wednesday, Jan. 22, at <a href="http://www.luc.edu/publications/crosscampus">http://www.luc.edu/publications/crosscampus</a>; paper copies also will be distributed via campus racks.

Letters are being mailed to undergraduates at their homes this week.

Mundelein College, the School of Law and The Graduate School are communicating with students via their school-based newsletters, which will be distributed and mailed at the end of the week.

Letters are being mailed to the homes of other graduate students this week.

The Jan. 23 issue of *Loyola World*, the faculty-staff newspaper, carries complete details about the tuition increases and will be delivered to departments and available on campus racks this week.

Phoenix editors and student government leaders have been alerted to the increase, and will be meeting with administrators to discuss details.

The increases are smaller than they have been for the past three years, and administrators expect this to be the last year of increases above national trends. The amounts of the increases vary by schools and colleges, reflecting the university's need to more closely align what students pay with the actual cost of providing a Jesuit, Catholic education at Loyola.

While increasing tuition lessens the gap between tuition and costs, Loyola continues to subsidize students' educations. Additionally, the university continues to make significant increases in merit and need-based financial assistance.
