 Electing candidates that support REALTOR® quality of life principles.

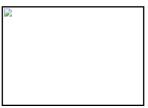
The campaign supports the National Association of REALTORS® "You've Got a Life—We let you live it" campaign, and incorporates N.A.R.'s "Smart Growth" program and its Land Use Initiative.

The Quality of Life program focuses on education and advocacy. It is designed to provide local associations and advocates with a toolbox of resources to assist with public outreach and lobbying local officials on growth management and land-use policies. W.A.R. is serving as the catalyst and resource to share information, expertise, research, training and other assistance with local associations.

To effectively implement the outreach program, WAR will conduct a survey and additional research, as well as create a communication plan, and develop and make recommendations on policy issues. The WAR. Executive Committee has pledged \$40,000 to begin the program, and most local associations have committed support (more than \$11,000 from 15 associations, to date). N.A.R.'s Issues Mobilization Committee is reviewing a request for additional funding.

"Clearly stating the REALTOR® position is increasingly important as Washington State marks and reviews the 10th anniversary of its Growth Management Act," said W.A.R. 2000 President Phil Souza. "Our state's act has been touted as the best growth management legislation and is used as a model throughout the country. The messages Washington sends and the measures adopted-both good and bad-will resonate across the country. It is critical to REALTORS® in every state considering growth management or smart growth legislation that we REALTORS® effectively advocate our agenda in Washington State."
